



- 2. Support for an immediate Executive Order by the Governor to ban law enforcement from using any means of restraint that cut off the ability to breathe.**
- 3. Support for the Governor to immediately establish a diverse Statewide Criminal Justice Commission that includes the reform of policing practices.**
